### **ACLS Provider & PALS Provider Pre-Course Work**

Students registered for the ACLS and PALS courses are now required to complete the Pre-Course Self-Assessment and a series of video lessons with knowledge checks before coming to class. These videos lessons are referred to as Pre-Course Work. Students must present their Pre-Course Self-Assessment scoring report, showing a passing score of at least 70%, and their Pre-Course Work Certificate of Completion when coming to class.

The benefits of this new class format will allow more classroom time to focus on hands-on skills training and leads to students being better prepared to participate as soon as they enter the classroom.

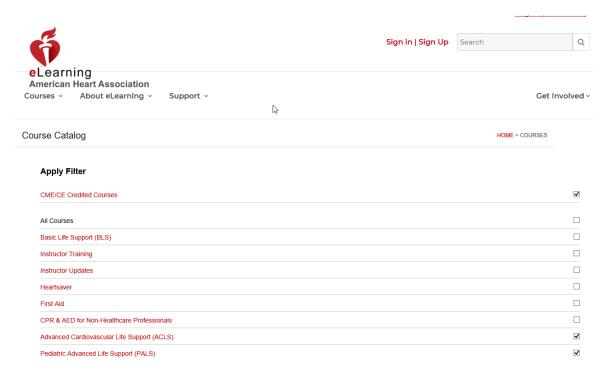
Note: Students, who have not completed the Pre-Course Self-Assessment and Pre-Course Work, will not be allowed to stay for class.

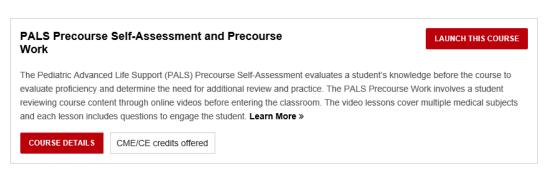

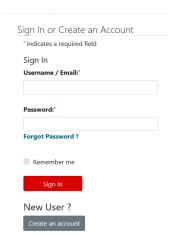
